A Rose By Any Other Name...

Susan was inspired by Charles Rennie Mackintosh, an influential designer during the Arts and Crafts movement in the early part of the last century, to create her appliquéd rose motif. She used the Essentials III collection from Studio E Fabrics for the background of this thought-provoking quilt. Our diagrams demonstrate her Give and Take™ appliqué technique, which creates positive and negative images with fast fusing.

Fabric Requirements*

Red print, pink print, dark green print, and bright green print (blocks)
White print and black print (blocks)
Assorted black florals (Eight-Patch Blocks, piecing)
Assorted white florals (Eight-Patch Blocks, piecing)
Black or white large floral (binding)
Paper-backed fusible web
Backing (piece widthwise)
Batting size

See-through template plastic (optional) Appliqué pressing sheet (optional)

*In this pattern, "black" and "white" refer to background colors.

**A fat quarter is an 18" x 20-22" cut of fabric.

Cutting Instructions (cut in order shown)

Red print and pink print-

cut from each:

2 squares 8" x 8"

2 strips 23/8" x 20"

Dark green print and bright green print-

cut from each:

4 rectangles 41/4" x 8"

White print and black print—cut from each:

4 squares 8" x 8"

6 rectangles 41/4" x 8"

Assorted black florals-

cut a total of:

3 strips 8" x 191/4"

4 squares 8" x 8"

6 rectangles 41/4" x 8"

2 squares 41/4" x 41/4"

2 strips 23/8" x 20"

Assorted white florals—

cut a total of:

3 strips 8" x 191/4"

7 squares 8" x 8"

1 strip 41/4" x 38"

2 strips 41/4" x 191/4"

5 rectangles 41/4" x 8"

2 strips 23/8" x 20"

Black or white large floral

7 strips 21/2" x width of fabric (binding)

Paper-backed fusible web

4 squares 8" x 8"

8 rectangles 41/4" x 8"

Appliquéing and Piecing the Blocks

1) Use sharp pencil to trace Rose pattern on paper side of paper-backed fusible web 8" square (Diagram I). Trace 4. In same manner, trace 4 each Leaf and Reversed Leaf patterns on fusible web 41/4" x 8" rectangles. Optional: For help with accurate placement of appliqué, use fine-line permanent marker to trace Rose and Leaf/ Reversed Leaf patterns on see-through template plastic, including outer lines of square/rectangle.







manufacturer's instructions, fuse traced fusible web Rose square to wrong side of red print 8" square, aligning raw edges (Diagram II). Make 2. In same manner, make 2 using pink squares. Fuse 2 each traced fusible web Leaf and Reversed Leaf patterns to wrong sides of dark green rectangles. Repeat with bright green rectangles. Note: Using an appliqué pressing sheet will help protect your iron when fusing.


3 Allow fused fabric squares and rectangles to cool. Using a sharp pair of scissors, make one continuous cut on each traced line of fused red square to cut 8 total interior Rose pieces, 1 Rose outline shape, and 1 Rose background shape (Diagram III). Repeat to cut remaining fused squares/rectangles. Keep cut Rose pieces together per square, to make appliqué process easier.







Remove paper from back of red Rose square background shape and place fusible web side down on right side of white print 8" square, aligning outer edges (Diagram IV-A). Fuse in place. Using optional plastic tracing (face down) to help with placement if desired, remove paper from and position 8 red interior Rose pieces, creating rose shape (Diagram IV-B). When pleased with arrangement, fuse in place. Repeat to make 2 Rose Blocks. Make 2 using pink Rose background and interior pieces on black print squares (Diagram IV-C).










6 Remove paper from back of red Rose outline shape and place fusible web side down on right side of white print 8" square, centering (Diagram V-A). Fuse in place. Repeat to make 2 Rose Blocks. Make 2 using pink Rose outline shapes on black print squares (Diagram V-B).



6 In similar manner, use pieces cut from dark green and bright green Leaf/Reversed Leaf fused rectangles, plus white print and black print rectangles, to make 12 total Leaf/Reversed Leaf Blocks (Diagram VI). You will have 2 leaf and 2 leaf background pieces left over.




Machine zigzag stitch all appliqué raw edges with matching thread (Diagram VII).



8 Referring to **Diagram VIII**, sew 2 pink and 2 assorted black floral 20" strips together. Make 1. Press in direction of arrows. Cut into 6 segments 23%" wide.



Repeat process using 2 assorted white floral and 2 red strips. Sew together 2 matching segments to make Eight-Patch Block (**Diagram IX**). Make 6 total.





Quilt Top Assembly

Note: Refer to **Assembly Diagram** for following steps.

9 Sew top vertical row using 2 Rose Blocks and 1 assorted white floral or black floral 41/4" x 8" rectangle. Make 3 total. Stitch together 1 assorted rectangle, 1 Rose Block, and 1 assorted 8" square. Make 2 total. Sew together 5 vertical rows as shown. Add white 41/4" x 191/4" strips to sides. Stitch black 41/4" squares to ends of white 38" strip. Sew to top to complete upper section.

10 Stitch bottom vertical row using 2 Leaf Blocks, 1 black and 1 white 8" square, 1 white 191/4" strip, and pink Eight-Patch Block. Make 3 total. Sew together 2 assorted rectangles, 2 Reversed Leaf Blocks, 1 white 8" square, 1 black 191/4" strip, and red Eight-Patch Block. Make 3 total. Sew together 6 vertical rows as shown to make lower section. Join upper and lower sections.


Quilting and Finishing

Dayer, baste, and quilt. Arlene machine quilted an allover flourish motif and outline quilted the roses and leaves. Bind with black or white large floral.
