

# Web Bonus: Prism Table Runner

Skill Level  
**CONFIDENT BEGINNER**

Finished Table Runner Size  
12½" x 48½"

Number of Blocks and Finished Size  
3 Pinwheel Blocks 4" x 4"

## Fabric Requirements

White/black dot (Pinwheel Blocks)	8" x 10" piece
Black/white zigzag stripe (Pinwheel Blocks, binding)	½ yd.
3 assorted bright prints (piecing)	8" x 10" piece <b>each</b>
White print (background)	½ yd.
Backing	1¼ yds.
Batting size	20" x 56"

## Planning

This fun table runner features graphic black and white pinwheels bracketed by bands of color and set on a white background.

## Cutting Instructions (cut in order listed)

- White/black dot
  - 6 squares 2⅞" x 2⅞"
- Black/white zigzag stripe
  - 4 strips 2½" x width of fabric  
(WOF) for binding
- 6 squares 2⅞" x 2⅞"
- 3 assorted bright prints—**cut from each:**
  - 2 rectangles 4½" x 6½"
- White print
  - 2 strips 4½" x 20½"
  - 2 strips 4½" x 16½"
  - 2 strips 4½" x 12½"
- Backing
  - 1 strip 20" x 56", pieced from
  - 2 WOF strips

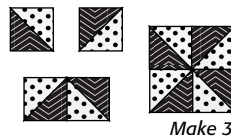
## Piecing the Blocks and Strips

1 Draw diagonal line on wrong side of white/black dot 2⅞" square. Referring to **Diagram I**, place marked square on black/white zigzag stripe 2⅞" square, right sides together. Sew ¼" seam on each side of marked line; cut apart on marked line. Open and press to make 2 pieced squares. Make 12.



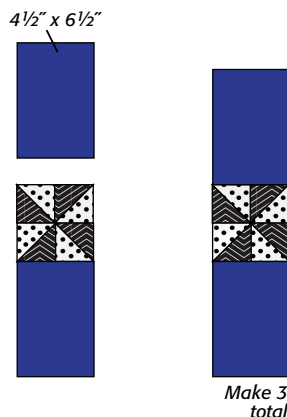
**Diagram I**

2 Referring to **Diagram II**, sew together 4 pieced squares to make Pinwheel Block. Make 3.

3 Sew matching bright print 4½" x 6½" rectangles to opposite sides of Pinwheel Block to make pieced strip (**Diagram III**). Make 3 total.

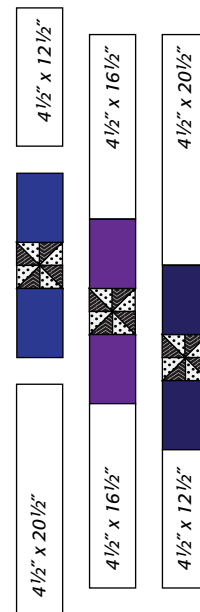

## Assembling the Quilt Top

Note: Refer to **Assembly Diagram** for following step.

4 Sew 3 vertical rows using pieced strips and white print strips shown. Sew rows together.

## Quilting and Finishing

5 Layer, baste, and quilt. Bind with black/white zigzag strip.
